



Through theater games, students will:

- Observe the anatomy of a conflict
- Learn how to de-escalate a situation with their peers
- Role play resolving conflicts
- Learn I-statements to express needs

Explorative Questions

- 1. How do conflicts start?
- 2. What happens to the body when conflicts happen?
- 3. What does it mean to transform something?
- 4. What would it feel like to argue from someone else's perspective?
- 5. What is a win-win situation?

Sample Activities

Numbers/Gibberish Argument (Grades 2-5)

Students examine the anatomy of an argument by using gibberish to argue.

Switching Feet Argument (Grades 2-5)

Students pretend argue only to switch their argument right in the middle.

Give me that Bench!

Students attempt to get a spot on a bench but can only do so using non-violent wording.

Forum Theater (Grades 3-5)

Students role play a conflicting situation, and the audience gives solutions for resolving issues.
